

#### Junior and Open Shows Entry Deadline: December 1, 2004

The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo is committed to the humane treatment of all animals exhibited. Every possible precaution is taken to insure the animals' safety and well-being. The production practices in the livestock industry are based on good principals of animal husbandry. No one has a greater economic stake in the welfare of animals than the livestock producers and organizations involved in the promotion of agriculture.

#### Definitions

As used in these rules, the following Definitions shall apply.

- A. "Auction Caps" shall mean the maximum sums, as stated in Rule 18 of the Junior Livestock Show Special Rules, that shall be allocable to Premiums for Exhibitors in the various Departments of the Junior Livestock Show. No Exhibitor shall be entitled to a Premium, including scholarship benefits and add-ons, on account of the sale of his or her animal in the Junior Auction, in excess of the applicable amount stated in Rule 18 of the Junior livestock Show Special Rules, regardless of the amount bid for such animal at the Junior Auction.
- B. The "Board" shall mean the Board of Directors of the Star of Texas Fair & Rodeo. "Executive Committee" shall mean the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo.
- **C.** "**Department**" means any of the following divisions of the Livestock Show:

Junior Market Steers

Junior Market Lambs

Junior Market Goats

Junior Market Barrows

Junior Market Turkeys

Junior Market Roasters

Junior Market Broilers

Junior Market Rabbits

Junior Breeding Heifers

Junior Sheep Shearing Contest

Junior Beef Bowl

Junior Texas Shootout

Open Breeding Cattle

Open Breeding Goats

Open Stockdog Trials

- **D**. "Exhibitor" shall mean the bonafide owner of the animal.
- **E**. **"Junior Livestock Auction"** shall mean the auction sale staged as an event of the Junior Market Livestock Show for qualifying Exhibitors and their entries.
- **F.** "Junior Livestock Show" shall mean the contests in the Departments identified in these Rules open to Participants who satisfy the requirements to be an Exhibitor under these Rules.
- G. "Major Livestock Show" refers to any of the following: San Antonio Livestock Exposition, Houston Livestock Show, Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, Star of Texas Fair & Rodeo, San Angelo Livestock Show, El Paso Livestock Show, Rio Grande Valley Livestock Show and the State Fair of Texas.

- H. "Market Animal" means an animal entered in a Department, the entries in which are eligible to be sold in the Junior Market Livestock Auction.
- I. "Participant" or one who "participates" shall mean an Exhibitor, a member of the Board, a member of the Executive Committee, a Show Official, a Supervisor or any other individual who enters and or takes part in any of the events and activities of the Show.
- **J**. **"Premium"** shall mean an award of any kind, including scholarships, cash, plaques, ribbons, trophies, and other such articles awarded to or received by Exhibitors as prizes for accomplishments in the Show.
- **K**. **"Privilege"** shall mean the opportunity to participate in the Show and specifically includes the opportunity to exhibit, to compete for Premiums, to offer for sale or sell any exhibit in any auction or other sale staged as part of the Show.
- L. "Scholarship" means a sum to be paid by the Show's scholarship fund for an Exhibitor's post high school education or training. Post high school education may include cost and expenses of attending junior or senior colleges and universities, trade and vocational schools and participating in job training programs approved by the Show.
- M. The "Show" shall mean the Star of Texas Fair & Rodeo, "STFR", and the events and activities that it sponsors.
- N. "Show Grounds" shall mean the grounds of the Travis County Exposition Center, where the Star of Texas Fair & Rodeo is held annually.
- O. "Show Official" means an adult individual who has been duly appointed by the Executive Committee to assist with the Show, including, but not limited to Staff, Board Members, Committee Chairs, Sub-Committee Chairs, Judges, Classifiers, Official Veterinarian, Arena Directors and Department Superintendents.
- **P.** "Supervisor" shall mean an adult individual who is either (a) a County Extension Agent, "CEA", who is supervising members of a 4-H Club whose members are Exhibitors in the Show or (b) a High School Agricultural Science Teacher, "AST", who is supervising members of an FFA Chapter whose members are Exhibitors in the Show.

#### RULES

1. Interpretation and Violation of Rules: Individuals, including Participants, are requested to report any rule violation(s) to the Management immediately so that appropriate action may be taken. The Executive Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with, or incident to, the Show; and to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. Any exhibitor who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and Premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order.

The Executive Committee shall have the further right to delegate any or all of the rights, authorities and responsibilities which it has under these Rules to such Show Officials as it deems appropriate.

- **Eligibility:** Competition is open to the world, with the exception of the Junior Show (See Junior Show Rules). This is an invitational Livestock Show; The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Executive Committee reserve the right to extend or withhold an invitation to any Exhibitor or Contestant.
- 3. Social Security Number Requirement: All exhibitors and contestants must have a personal Social Security Number to be eligible to participate in the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo. Social Security Numbers must be recorded on entry forms. International Exhibitors and Contestants may be approved on an individual basis.
- **Entry Deadline:** All entries must be received electronically through the official STFR online entry program on or before December 1, 2004. Entries must be filled out online at <a href="www.rodeoaustin.com">www.rodeoaustin.com</a>. Texas Longhorn entries must be entered online before February 1, 2005.

- **Entry Forms:** Application for entry must be made through the online entry procedures located on the internet at <a href="https://www.rodeoaustin.com">www.rodeoaustin.com</a>. You must submit payment with entry authorization signatures to: Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Livestock Office, 9100 Decker Lake Rd., Austin, TX 78724. Payment with entry authorization signature must be postmarked December 15, 2004. The right is reserved to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry and to refuse any accepted entry admittance to the grounds.
- **Entry Fees:** The following entry fees will be charged for all entries. All entry fees must be postmarked on or before December 15, 2004.

No entry will be accepted unless entry has been submitted online on or before December 1, 2004 and payment with entry signature authorization postmarked on or before December 15, 2004. If the bank for any reason should return the check accompanying entries, the entry will be canceled and returned. There will be a \$25.00 service charge on all returned checks. STFR has the right to ban any exhibitor from future participation should there be a continuous problem with fees from exhibitor.

- 7. Trim Chutes: Only authorized equipment will be allowed on grounds and must be placed in locations designated by the Superintendent. Trim Chute Permits may be purchased for Open Breeding Beef Cattle Only at \$20.00/chute according to the following limits: Open Breeding Beef Cattle 1 chute/5 head; Junior Steers & Junior Breeding Heifers Trim Chutes NOT allowed. Trim Chute Permits may be purchased with entries. Trim Chutes will be allowed in designated areas only. Blocking of aisles will NOT be permitted.
- **8. Scales:** Scales will be provided by the Show. Electronic Load Bar Scales for cattle are permitted in designated locations pending approval of the Superintendent.
- **Passes:** Open and Junior Show Passes will be mailed. Open Show Passes will be mailed to the owner. Junior Show passes will be mailed to the Supervisor submitting entries. There will be a \$5.00 handling fee charged for each 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.

**Gate Passes:** Each owner will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Livestock Show and may purchase up to five (5) more. CEAs & ASTs who are supervising projects will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Livestock Show.

Gate Pass (Valid for 16 days of the Livestock Show) \$25.00

Car Passes: Each owner will be eligible to purchase up to five (5) Car Passes for each week they are showing. CEAs & ASTs who are supervising projects will be issued one (1) free Car Pass for each week exhibitors are showing.

**Car Passes** must be fully affixed to the windshield. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped, or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Car Pass and loss of parking privileges.

Week #2 Car Pass (Valid M	March 20 - 26, 2005)	\$15.00

- **10. Parking:** Livestock Exhibitors must enter through the Gate #3 Livestock Entrance on Decker Lake Rd. Week #1 Pass valid March 11-20, 2005; Week #2 Pass valid March 20 March 26, 2005. Large trucks and all trailers must park in designated areas. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be towed at owner's expense.
- 11. Animal Substitution: Substitutions are done only in the Main Livestock Office. Substitutions NOT officially recorded in this manner are invalid. Substitutions will NOT be permitted once check-in is completed. Substitution forms must be filled out completely including the certification by the CEA or AST on all Junior Entries. Registration Certificates will be required to verify ownership. Substitution of owners is NOT permitted. There are two (2) types of Substitutions:
  - **Type A** Same Breed and Sex: All information must match the original entry; owners name, department, breed and sex of animal must be identical to the original entry. Fee \$20.00.
  - **Type B** Different Breed and/or Sex: Owners name and department must match the original entry, breed and/or sex of animal may be different. Fee \$20.00.
- **12. Refunds:** There will be no refund of fees.
- 13. **Premiums, Market and Auction Proceeds:** Premium monies from all sources will be distributed by the STFR. No premium checks will be issued until all funds from all sources are received by STFR. If payment is not received, classes for that breed will be canceled. Premium checks for Open Show owners will be mailed to the address shown on the entry form.

Checks for sifted and non-placing animals will be distributed by Texas Livestock Marketing Association. Market/floor money will be forfeited if the animal is condemned at slaughter. Auction checks will be distributed by STFR when funds have been collected from buyers.

- **Special Rules:** Special Rules are published in any department where necessary. If there is a conflict between the Special Rules and the General Rules, Livestock Management will govern the final ruling.
- **15. Erroneous Entry:** Animals that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to the proper class, prior to judging, upon application to the Superintendent, who will determine the matter. If such classes have been judged they shall not be reopened. No animal shall be changed from one class to another after the deadline date unless it is ineligible for the class in which it is entered.
- **Objectionable Exhibits:** The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal or entry that may be falsely entered, or deemed unsuitable, or objectionable, without assigning a reason therefore. All fees will be forfeited.
- 17. Unauthorized Animals: Any animal(s) brought onto the grounds which is/are NOT entered for competition or exhibition will become the property of the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo and will be disposed of as the Executive Committee may direct.
- **18. Barred Exhibitors:** The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo, in cooperation with member Shows of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association and Rule Infraction Database, reserves the right to refuse entry of any exhibitor who has been barred from any Show on the basis of unethical practices.
- **19. Decisions:** The decision of the judges will be final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion, not discovered at the time of award, is proven. Any objections to a judge must be submitted as an Official Protest (See Official Protest Rule).

**20. Official Protests:** Official Protests must be submitted to the Main Livestock Office in writing and accompanied by a \$300.00 deposit which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore, and must be delivered to the Management immediately upon the occasion for such protest. Any protest not officially filed within 24 hours of the alleged incident may not be considered. These cases are referred to the Executive Committee whom will have full power to act and from whose decision there can be no appeal. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation.

The Executive Committee shall have the further right to delegate any or all of the rights, authorities and responsibilities which it has under these Rules to such Show Officials as it deems appropriate

- 21. Sifting/Classifying Committees: Breed Associations and/or STFR will appoint Sifters and Classifiers to inspect animals. Exhibitors must remove blankets from animals at inspection. Animals judged unworthy must be removed. Decisions of the Sifters and/or Classifiers will be final and protests will not be considered. Interference with Sifters and/or Classifiers will not be tolerated. Exhibitors and others are requested not to question their decisions, and to do so may disqualify the exhibitor concerned.
- **22. Judging:** Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the times at which their animals will be judged. Any animal not presented promptly will be ruled ineligible and barred from competition in the class. No complaint or protest on the grounds that the judge overlooked animals will be considered.
- **23. Interference:** If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by agent, or servant, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows any disrespect to them, or the Show, the Management may demand a proper apology from the exhibitor, may exclude him/her from competition, bar him/her from the grounds, and may also withhold any prizes that may have been awarded.
- **24. Disqualification:** Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the lower placing animals will NOT move into the higher position.
- **25. Liability:** All exhibits will be under the control and direction of the Management, but STFR will in no case be responsible for any loss, injury or damage which may occur. The exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the rules. He/She shall indemnify STFR against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as any damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited with such exhibition or any of the animals so exhibited.
- **Ownership Requirements:** All animals must be entered in the name of the owner(s) as shown on the Registration Certificate. All parties in a multiple ownership must be on the entry form. Firms and partnerships must be in existence at the time of making entry. Custom fitters must be listed on the entry form in the appropriate space.

Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in the name of the owner(s) no less than thirty days prior to the opening day of the General Livestock Show with the exception of the Junior Show (see Department rules). Purchase, delivery, possession and registration must all take place not less than thirty days prior to the opening day of the General Livestock Show with the exception of the Junior Show. Superintendents will check Original Registration Certificates at time of check-in.

Registration and Health Certificates must be available at all times during the Show. Validation, bill of sale or other proof of ownership may be required for Market Animals.

- **Animal Care:** All owners or persons in charge of property, or livestock, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as STFR does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss, shrinkage, or damage to said property or livestock or the owners or exhibitors thereof. STFR does not assume ownership of livestock projects entered in the Show.
- **28. Unethically Fitted Livestock & Poultry:** The showing of unethically fitted livestock and poultry, the showing of livestock and poultry of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered, or the misrepresentation of breeding or milking status is prohibited.

In addition unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of changing the normal conformation of any part of the animals' body or using drugs, including over the counter and/or extra-label, or mechanical devices to alter the physical makeup and/or performance of the animal. This includes but is not limited to the following:

- **a.** Animals that are in milk due to an unnaturally induced lactation.
- **b.** Balancing the udder by any means other than leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
- **c.** Treating or massaging any part of the animal's body, internally or externally, with an irritant, counterirritant, or other substance to temporarily improve conformation.
- **d.** Minimizing the effects of cramping by feeding or injecting drugs and depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment except normal exercise.
- **e.** Blocking the nerves to prevent limping or switching of the tail.
- **f.** Striking the animal to cause swelling in a depressed area.
- g. Surgery or other practices performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, hide, or hair, except the removal of warts or horns and permitted clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
- **h.** Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
- **i.** Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area on the animals' body. Any grooming material that allows color to come off from any animal will not be allowed at the Show.
- **j.** The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus), is prohibited.
- **k.** The use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- **l.** The use of diuretics.
- **m.** Administration of a drug internally or externally at the Show.
- **n.** Administration of a drug internally or externally prior to the Show that does not meet proper withdrawal times as set by the FDA.

All medication administered during the Livestock Show must be administered by the Official STFR Veterinarian and a written medication record must be filed. Animals receiving performance enhancing drugs (including, but not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-imflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers) in this manner are ineligible for competition.

The Official Show Veterinary, in agreement with the Livestock Manager, reserves the right to treat any animal if, in the opinion of the Official Show Veterinarian it is in the best interest of the animal's health and well-being to be treated. If the Official Show Veterinary administers treatment to an animal and therefore uses any medication that does not meet the appropriate withdrawal time, the animal will be determined ineligible for competition.

The term "drug" shall mean any substance for which the sale, possession or use is controlled by license under federal, state, or local laws or regulation and any substance commonly used by the medical or veterinary professions which affects the circulatory, respiratory, musculatory, skeletal or central nervous system of any species of livestock. If drugs are used by an Official Show Veterinarian to treat a recognized disease in market animals, the withdrawal times listed by the drug manufacturer will be strictly followed.

The exhibitor specifically represents that no animal entered by him/her is unethically fitted, and that the breeding age and milking status is correctly stated. All Junior Market and Breeding Animals will be required to have signatures on each entry form stating that the animal was not unethically fitted. These forms must be signed by the following:

- a. Junior Exhibitor
- **b.** Parent or Guardian
- c. County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher

All exhibitors are responsible for security of their own animal(s) until they depart for their final destination (processing/ranch).

The exhibitor agrees to submit any animal, breeding and/or market, entered by him/her to inspection by any veterinarian appointed by the Executive Committee and agrees to have such animal submitted to such tests as may be requested at any time. STFR also reserves the right to have ultrasound, D.N.A., blood and/or urine laboratory analysis made on any animal entered for competition. The exhibitor, including his or her parent or guardian or AST or CEA for Junior exhibitors, must be present during the collection for analysis and must witness, seal and initial the sample as well as sign the appropriate sample documentation; thus verifying the sample to be properly collected and prepared for

analysis. The conclusions reached by the veterinarian and analyses shall be final and conclusive without recourse against STFR or any officer, director, or employee thereof or any veterinarian as appointed by the Executive Committee. The exhibitor waives any right of action which he might have for any action taken under this rule, and releases STFR and the veterinarian from any and all claims or demands whatsoever in connection with the inspection or testing of any such animal or any ruling or action taken by reason of the conclusion of such veterinarian.

As breeding animals are not entering the food chain, the USDA Wholesome Meat Act does not apply; however, breeding animals may be closely screened for any performance enhancing compounds. This includes, but is not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers.

In the event any animal is declared by Show officials, veterinarian or analyzing agency to be unethically fitted, the Executive Committee is authorized to permanently bar the exhibitor and his or her family from any further participation in the STFR. Reinstatement of anyone barred may be made only by a majority vote of the Executive Committee. The exhibitor will forfeit all titles, awards, prizes, auction proceeds, premiums and scholarships if the animal and/or exhibitor is disqualified. Market/Floor money will be forfeited if the animal is condemned at slaughter.

- **Testing:** All Quality Assurance Testing, sample collection and laboratory analysis required by STFR, will be paid for by STFR. Payment for any other tests (i.e. blood typing, etc.) required in the Junior or Open Livestock Show will be the sole responsibility of the exhibitor.
- **30. Animal Health Requirements:** State Law requires livestock, poultry and rabbits entering the grounds to be accompanied by proper health papers which shall be presented at the time livestock, poultry and rabbits arrive on the grounds. See Texas Animal Health Commission Rules for details. There will be no exceptions. All livestock, poultry and rabbits must enter through GATE #3 only. Health Papers are NOT required for Junior Market Animals.
- 31. **Diseased Animals:** No animals having a disease of any character will be admitted to the grounds at any time, and the Superintendents are instructed and authorized to refuse unloading privileges to any livestock, poultry and rabbits having a disease or undesirable ailment. Market/Floor money will be forfeited if the animal is condemned at slaughter.
- **Veterinarians / Medication:** Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type of performance enhancing medication to include, but not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers, are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors with questions regarding medications and/or eligibility should consult with the Official STFR Veterinarian prior to competition.

For the convenience of exhibitors, STFR arranges to have veterinarians available; however, they do NOT donate their services or medications. Fees should be discussed before treatment.

All medication administered during the Livestock Show must be administered by the Official STFR Veterinarian and a written medication record must be filed. Animals receiving performance enhancing drugs (i.e. including, but not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers) in this manner are ineligible for competition.

- **33. Breeding Animals:** Animals in the breeding classes must be recorded or accepted for record in the recognized book of their breed. This rule does not apply to the Open Breeding Meat Goat Show. Exhibitor must give the following: (a) owner's name (b) mailing address (c) social security number (d) breed (e) name (f) registration number (g) sex and (h) birthdate of the animal. If any of this information is not given, the entry will not be accepted unless otherwise stated in individual Department Rules.
- 34. Restraint / Unruly Animals: Show Officials, may remove any unruly animal from the Show; there will be no appeal. Cattle must be shown with halter and be sufficiently gentle to be properly handled by one attendant on foot except for animals participating in the Texas Longhorn non-halter classes. Bulls over 240 days must have a nose ring or nose lead, all other cattle must have a curb chain, when not tied in stalls. The use of nose leads is encouraged on all bulls. When cattle are not attended by the exhibitor, the cattle must be restrained with halter in the designated cattle tie.
- **Exhibitor Safety:** If exhibition of an animal poses a danger to the exhibitor and/or other parties, Show Officials reserve the right to: (1) allow a substitute exhibitor or (2) remove the animal from competition.

- **36. Nurse Cows:** Nurse cows are NOT permitted.
- **37. Barren Animals:** No barren animals are eligible in breeding classes. STFR reserves the right to palpate or semen test.
- **38. Stalling:** In so far as possible, shelter will be provided for livestock. The Show does not charge a stall fee in barns and does not guarantee stall space to any entry. Individual shows may charge a stall fee. Stalls will be assigned upon arrival. Special stalling requests will NOT be considered. Junior Market Steers, Junior Breeding Heifers, Market Lambs and Market Goats are pre-stalled; see specific pre-stalling guidelines listed in the appropriate species section. Early arrivals will be required to tie-out at trailer parking until assigned arrival.
- **39. Bedding / Feed:** Initial bedding will be provided by STFR. The use of artificial grass mats for bedding is prohibited in all barns. Straw/Hay bedding is prohibited. Additional bedding may be purchased from the Show.
- **40. Stalls, Pens and Alleys:** Stalls, pens, alleys and exhibit spaces must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day. Refuse matter must be disposed of as follows:

Manure and/or bedding: Designated Dumpsters

Trash: Trash barrels

Feed, or equipment boxes, etc. are not permitted in the main alleys or in barn aisles. No lights are to be strung on the stalls or pens, unless approved by the Livestock Manager.

- **41. Release:** No animal may be removed from the grounds without official written release. All animals must remain in stalls or pens until their designated release time. There will be no early release without written consent from Livestock Management. Anyone attempting to load animals before their release time may have his/her truck and/or trailer towed away. No Livestock may exit the grounds between 10:00 p.m.-7:00 a.m. Any violation of release times may cause the forfeiture of all premium and/or sale monies earned and the exhibitor may be barred from future participation.
- **Photographs:** Exhibitors agree to present their animal(s) at the request of Show Officials for official photographs. All photographs taken by the official photographer(s) become the property of STFR. Unofficial (i.e. personal) photographs may not be published without written approval of Management. Exhibitors wishing to purchase photographs must contact the official photographer.
- **Signs:** A sign is required over each animal including owner's name and organization, a maximum of 14 x 22 inches. Sign must be provided by the exhibitor and placed above the pen. Management reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed. No sign which refers in any way to a commercial product, including "For Sale" signs, may be placed over any livestock exhibit; such signs will be confiscated.
- **Exhibitor Numbers:** Each Breeding Show entry or owner will be assigned a number. Exhibitors will receive forms, which correspond with the numbers; numbers must be displayed by exhibitor when animals are being judged.
- **45. Electrical Equipment:** All electrical equipment brought onto the grounds must conform to all applicable safety regulations. Any exhibitor who refuses to cooperate with Show Management in this matter will have their exhibit immediately removed from the grounds. The exhibitor will forfeit all fees and premiums.
- **46. Generators/Fuels:** Generators and flammable fuels are prohibited on Show grounds.
- **Campers/Trailers:** Pickup trucks with campers may park inside grounds but cannot be used as living quarters. House and cook trailers are not permitted to enter the grounds.
- **48. Pets:** No pets allowed on grounds.
- **49. Notice to Parents or Guardians of Participants:** STFR, at its election, may choose to use photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of Participants in future publications including but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, television, promotional literature, World Wide Web (Internet) and STFR programs. By allowing your child or ward to

enter events of the STFR, you are deemed to have consented to such uses of photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of your child or ward.

**Notice to Adult Participants:** STFR, at its election, may chose to use photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of Participants in future publications including, but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, television, promotional literature, World Wide Web (Internet) and STFR Programs. By Participating in events of STFR, you are deemed to have consented to such uses of photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of yourself.

#### 51. Notice to Participants

#### WARNING

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), AN EQUINE PROFESSIONAL IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN EQUINE ACTIVITIES RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES.

#### WARNING

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), A LIVESTOCK SHOW SPONSOR IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN A LIVESTOCK SHOW RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF LIVESTOCK SHOW ACTIVITIES.

**ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo officials are allowed to impose animal health regulations that are more restrictive than those imposed by the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC). Specific TAHC regulations will supercede the show requirements if there is a dispute between the two in which show rules are less restrictive than TAHC regulations.

The Show considers itself an interstate (accepting entries of livestock and poultry from within Texas and from other states) show for livestock entries. Exhibitors with livestock originating outside the state of Texas are encouraged to contact their state Animal Health officials to confirm specific requirements, if any, their state may impose on animals returning from a Texas show.

#### **Routine Inspection Procedures (What the Exhibitor Should Expect):**

- **a.** Representatives of the Show should meet the incoming livestock vehicle at the Gate 3 check-in trailer.
- **b.** All documents are to be examined and a visual inspection of the shipment is to be made. Be certain that certificates of veterinary inspection, EIA test information, permits, etc. are still valid. A visual exam of the animals is to be made to ensure that the animals described on the documents are the same as those in the shipment.
- **c.** If shipments meet all entry requirements, allow the driver to proceed without delay. Return the certificates and other documents to the owner or driver.
- **d.** If shipment does not meet the requirements, the driver should pull the truck or trailer out of the traffic's way. If animals must be unloaded, they must remain in a separate pen (holding area) away from other livestock. Individuals should be allowed to contact the Show veterinarian or their own veterinarian to obtain proper documents and/or test. Documentation must be in writing no corrections will be allowed by phone. Fax documents are permissible.

**Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments required by the Texas Animal Health Commission were completed. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the State of Texas as stated in the following summary of entry requirements.

**Prior Entry Permits** are required as noted for specific classes of livestock. Permits may be obtained by calling (800) 550-8242 or (512) 719-0777, 24 hours a day, or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 Kramer Lane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.

**Interstate Show**: The TAHC considers shows, fairs or exhibitions to be interstate if they allow livestock and poultry from other states to enter for exhibition and be held or exhibited in common facilities with Texas-origin livestock and poultry of the same species.

**Intrastate Show**: The TAHC considers shows, fairs or exhibitions to be intrastate if they allow ONLY Texas animals-or if they require Texas livestock and poultry of the same species to be housed and exhibited apart from livestock and poultry from out of state.

#### **Market Animals**

All market steers, barrows, lambs, poultry and goats entering all intrastate shows, fairs and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock and poultry of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock and poultry from out-of-state) are exempt from the entry permit, certificate of veterinary inspection and testing requirements, except poultry which must originate from flocks or hatcheries free of pullorum disease and fowl typhoid or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 days before exhibition.

#### **Cattle (Beef and Dairy)**

#### **Texas Origin Breeding Cattle**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within 30 (thirty) days for cattle that are parturient or post parturient or that are 18 months of age or older from non-certified free herds in Class "A" and "B" areas. Result must be noted on certificate of veterinary inspection. Exemption for cattle from a certified free herd or area; certified free herd number must be recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- **3.** Negative tuberculosis (TB) test within the past 60 (sixty) days with results noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection. Exemption for cattle from an accredited free herd or area; accredited herd number must be recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

#### **Out-of-State Origin Breeding Cattle**

- 1. Must meet the same requirements of Texas Origin Breeding cattle.
- The permit for entry is not required when cattle enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin.

#### **Junior Market Steers**

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection not required.

#### **BREEDING GOATS, MARKET GOATS**

#### **Texas Origin Goats & Out of State Origin Goats**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current within 30 (thirty) days (excluding Junior Market Goats).
- 2. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.
- **3.** Registered animals may use a registration tattoo or electronic identification (accompanied by reader) "as official identification", as long as registration papers accompany the animal.

#### **Junior Market Goats**

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection not required.

#### **SHEEP**

#### **Junior Market Lambs**

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection not required.

#### **SWINE**

#### **Junior Market Barrows**

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection not required.

#### **POULTRY**

#### **Texas Origin Poultry (Does not include youth market poultry)**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 (thirty) days or from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP).

- **3.** Domestic poultry must originate from a flock that is certified as Avian Influenza clean or from an Avian Influenza negative flock or tested according to TAHC requirements within 30 days of entry.
- **4.** Certification on Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that Laryngotracheitis has not been active in the area of origin in the past 30 days.
- **5.** Vaccination must be with vaccines approved by USDA and TAHC. (Contact TAHC for a list of approved vaccines.) NOTE: No modified live virus chick embryo origin Laryngotracheitis (LT) vaccine and no modified live virus mycoplasma gallisepticum (MG) attenuated vaccine may be used on poultry entering the state.

#### **Junior Market Poultry**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection not required.
- 2. Must originate from a Texas NPIP Hatchery.

#### **Equine**

- 1. Horses, Mules and Asses: All equine intended for exhibition purposes must be accompanied by an official health certificate. The certificate is valid for 45 days for movement for exhibition purposes only at shows, fairs, exhibitions and races. In addition to the above regulation, all equine must have an EIA test document (VS 10-11 form) indicating negative results to the AGID or CELISA test (test for Coggins or Swamp Fever) dated within 12 months of arrival on show grounds. In addition to the date and test results, the name of the laboratory conducting the test and a complete description of the horse must be shown on the certificate. Equine originating in a tick quarantined area must be accompanied by a certificate issued by an authorized representative of the Texas Animal Health Commission certifying the equine are free from infestation or exposure to fever ticks and have been dipped immediately prior to shipment.
- 2. The Texas Animal Health Commission, pursuant to the authority granted in Section 161.061 of the Texas Agriculture Code and rules adopted thereunder hereby imposes the following:

Any livestock entering Texas from a state where vesicular stomatitis has been diagnosed within the last 30 days must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with the following statement written by the accredited veterinarian on the certificate:

"The animals represented on this health certificate have not originated from a premise or area under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis or a premise on which VS has been diagnosed in the past thirty days . I have examined the animals and have found no signs of vesicular stomatitis."

#### DOGS

1. DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS because of safety and public health regulations. This rule will be strictly enforced and applies to exhibitors and their employees, as well as Show visitors. This rule does not apply to official dog entries in a sanctioned Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo competitive or entertainment event or to guide dogs for those with sight impairment. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current within 30 days is required to accompany all dogs eligible to enter the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Grounds. Certificate must state that the dog has had a rabies vaccination within the past year, prior to the last day of the Livestock Show.

#### EXOTIC LIVESTOCK AND RATITES

1. Exotic livestock are defined as grass-eating or plant-eating, single-hooved or cloven-hooved mammals that are not indigenous to this state and are known as ungulates, including animals from the swine, horse, tapir, camal, llama, rhinoceros, elephant, deer and antelope families.

#### CAMELIDAE

1. Camelidae are defined as members of the family of animals which include camel, llamas and vicunas. The domestic members of the genus lama include the llama, alpaca and guanaco.

#### **RATITES**

1. Ratites are defined as exotic fowl with a flat breastbone and small or nonexistent wings, such as ostriches, emu, rheas and kiwi.

#### EXOTIC BOVIDAE

1. Exotic bovidae are defined as non-indigenous members of the family of animals which includes water buffalo, gnu (wildebeast), addax, antelope and nilgai (among others).

#### EXOTIC CERVIDAE

1. Exotic cervidae are defined as non-indigenous members of the family of animals which includes deer, elk, moose, caribou, reindeer and the subfamily musk deer.

#### **Texas Orgin Camelidae**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within six months for all camelidae, 18 months of age and older.
- 3. All neutered camelidae are exempt from the brucellosis test requirement.
- 4. Negative tuberculosis (TB) test within six months for all camelidae, 18 months of age and older.

#### **Texas Origin Ratites**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Individually identified with an implanted electronic device (microchip). The identification will be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection along with the location and name brand of the implanted electronic device. Owner must supply appropriate reader. If an animal has more than one implanted microchip, then the location, microchip number and name brand of each will be documented on the certificate of veterinary inspection; and
- **3.** Tested and found to be serologically negative for Avian Influenza and Salmonella pullorum-typhoid from a sample collected within 30 days of entry. Birds or hatching eggs must originate from flocks that show no evidence of infectious disease and have no history of Avian Influenza in the past six months.

#### **Texas Origin Exotic Bovidae**

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within the past 30 (thirty) days.
- 3. Negative tuberculosis test within the past 60 (sixty) days.

#### Texas Origin Exotic Cervidae

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within the past 30 (thirty) days.
- 3. Two negative tuberculosis tests conducted no less than 90 days apart; the second test must be conducted within 90 days prior to the date of movement; and the animals must be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period, or;
  - A. Originate from an accredited free herd, or;
  - B. Originated from a qualified herd and have a classified negative 90 day tuberculosis test. If the qualifying herd test was administered within 90 days of movement, the animal(s) do not require an additional test, or:
  - C. Originate from a monitored herd and have a classified negative 90 day tuberculosis test, or;
  - D. Be less than 12 months of age, originate and were born in accredited, qualified or monitored herds and have not been exposed to cervids from a lower status.

#### JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW SPECIAL RULES

**JUNIOR ENTRY DEADLINE - DECEMBER 1, 2004** 

1. Eligibility: The Junior Market Poultry, Rabbits, Steers, Barrows, and Goats are limited to entries from within the following one hundred twenty (120) Texas Counties: Anderson, Aransas, Atascosa, Austin, Bandera, Bastrop, Bee, Bell, Bexar, Blanco, Bosque, Brazoria, Brazos, Brown, Brooks, Burleson, Burnet, Calhoun, Callahan, Caldwell, Chambers, Coleman, Colorado, Comal, Comanche, Concho, Coryell, Crockett, Dallas, DeWitt, Dimmit, Duvall, Eastland, Edwards, Ellis, Erath, Falls, Fayette, Fort Bend, Freestone, Frio, Galveston, Gillespie, Goliad, Gonzales, Grimes, Guadalupe, Hamilton, Harris, Hays, Hill, Hood, Houston, Irion, Jackson, Jim Hogg, Jim Wells, Johnson, Jones, Karnes, Kendall, Kenedy, Kerr, Kimble, Kinney, Kleberg, Lampasas, LaSalle, LaVaca, Lee, Leon, Liberty, Limestone, Live Oak, Llano, Madison, Mason, Matagorda, Maverick, McLennan, McCulloch, McMullen, Medina, Menard, Milam, Mills, Montgomery, Navarro, Nueces, Palo Pinto, Parker, Polk, Real, Refugio, Robertson, Runnels, San Jacinto, San Patricio, San Saba, Schleicher, Shackelford, Somervell, Stephens, Sutton, Tarrant, Taylor, Tom Green, Travis, Trinity, Uvalde, Val Verde, Victoria, Walker, Waller, Washington, Webb, Wharton, Williamson, Wilson and Zavala.

The Junior Beef Heifer Show, Junior Market Lamb, Junior Texas Shootout, Junior Beef Bowl and Junior Sheep Shearing are open to entries from within Texas. Junior Show exhibitors are subject to the General Rules as well as the Special Rules. Participants are responsible for knowing and complying with all rules of this Show.

Participation in the Junior Livestock Show is limited to Texas resident students, who are bonafide members of a Texas 4-H Club or Texas FFA Chapter, and who have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their animals or poultry under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST. Exhibitors must be enrolled in, and attending, public, private or home school elementary or secondary schools in Texas. Students must be between the ages of 9 and 18 on or before August 31, 2004. Exception: students in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade become eligible on their 8<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Exhibitors may enter as either a 4-H or FFA member, but not as both in the same Department. Any exhibitor who enters as both in the same Department will have all his/her entries disqualified without refund of fees.

**Ineligible Exhibitor:** A Junior exhibitor who has placed a Grand Champion Market Steer, Market Lamb, Market Barrow, Market Goat, Market Turkey, Market Roaster, Market Broiler or Market Rabbit at any prior Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo is NOT eligible to enter the department in which that Grand Champion was placed.

Junior exhibitors and contestants suspended under **Texas Education Code 33.081** "No Pass, No Play" are ineligible to participate in any Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Junior activity, event or competition. Any animal owned by an ineligible exhibitor is ineligible for competition.

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors are considered to be eligible by the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo to participate in the Junior Livestock Show at the time entries are received from the AST/CEA. Any AST/CEA who has a member in his/her 4-H or FFA program who becomes ineligible to participate in the Junior Livestock Show according to Texas Education Code must provide written and signed notification to the appropriate Superintendent of the Livestock Show at least 24 hours prior to any weighing, sifting, classifying or judging. If such notification is NOT received at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of competition, the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo will consider the exhibitor as eligible to participate.

- 2. Social Security Number Requirement: All exhibitors and contestants must have a personal Social Security Number to be eligible to participate in the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo. Social Security Numbers must be recorded on entry forms. International Exhibitors and Contestants may be approved on an individual basis.
- **3. Foreign Exchange Students:** Non-United States citizens and Foreign Exchange students are eligible to compete in the Junior Livestock Show provided they meet all other eligibility requirements. Such individuals are ineligible to receive STFR scholarships.
- **4. Entry:** The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo makes available to CEAs and ASTs in charge of 4-H Clubs or FFA livestock programs the opportunity to enter members in their programs in the Junior Livestock Show, subject to these Special Rules. These rules are only minimum requirements for participation in the Show and are not intended to limit

the right of any CEA or AST, or the Texas Cooperative Extension or the Texas Education Agency, to impose additional requirements as they deem necessary. The opportunity to enter 4-H Club and FFA members' projects in the Junior Livestock Show is made available only to CEAs and ASTs supervising these livestock projects. In no event are these rules to be construed as making any offer or opportunity available to any 4-H Club or FFA member. Processing and or deposit of funds does not constitute acceptance of entries from an individual and or club or chapter. Eligibility of individual members of a club or chapter are subject to verification and approval. In no event shall any CEA or AST be considered to be an agent of STFR for any purpose.

Entries in the Junior Show must be made by the CEA or AST under whose supervision the animals were fed and will be returned if submitted by others. The CEA or AST must certify on the entry form that the animal and the owner(s) are eligible under the rules of this Show. It is the responsibility of the CEA or AST to read all rules and check each entry form carefully before signing it. If entries are not correctly submitted they will be returned.

Entry receipts and signatures from 4-H and FFA must come in separate packages with separate checks. Junior entry receipts and signatures must be on current forms with a current Junior Summary Sheet for each club or chapter, listing all owners and their entries along with one (1) check to cover total fees due (entries and passes). Checks for Junior entries must be drawn on 4-H or FFA accounts, money orders, or cashier's checks. Personal checks will NOT be accepted.

- **Signatures:** All livestock exhibitors must have the required signatures (Exhibitor, AST / CEA and Parent or Guardian) on each Certification of Entry and Acknowledgement of Regulations Form.
- **6. Ownership:** Exhibitors must own their animals at the beginning of and throughout the entire feeding and fitting period. Exhibitors must feed, care for, and exhibit their animals without any aid or assistance during the entire feeding and fitting period except from the CEA, AST, Immediate Family Member, or other 4-H or FFA members from the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter from which the animals are entered. Show Management will rule on all issues regarding ownership (i.e. Ribbon, Premium, or Other Auction/Sale).
- 7. **Ownership/Feeding/Fitting Periods:** The required ownership, feeding and fitting periods are:

Market Steers: June 30, year prior to show
Market Lambs: October 31, year prior to show
Market Goats: October 31, year prior to show
Market Barrows: November 30, year prior to show
Market Rabbits: February 12, year of show

Market Animals: Validation and/or sales receipt will be used to verify ownership date for market animals.

**Breeding Animals**: Original Registration Certificates will be used to verify ownership date for breeding animals. Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in the name of the Junior owner on or before the required ownership date (see below). Purchase, delivery, possession and registration must all take place on or before the required ownership date. Superintendents will check Original Registration Certificates at time of check-in.

Breeding Beef November 1, 2004

- **8. Partnerships:** Partnership animals are NOT eligible in the Junior Livestock Show.
- **9. Ineligible Animals:** Any animal owned by an ineligible exhibitor is ineligible for competition. Any animal which has sold at auction at any Major Livestock Show is NOT eligible for the Junior Show.
- **Double Entries:** Animals shown in the Junior Show may also be shown in the Open Show if classes are available. See instructions in the Special Rules of each Department.
- 11. **Exhibitor Substitution:** Entries in the Junior Show must be shown by their owner. Exhibitor substitutions may be allowed under the following conditions. In all cases, the Department Superintendent must approve the exhibitor substitution and will do so only if all conditions are met.

Substitute exhibitors may show only one animal, in addition to their own project, in each Junior Market Department.

**Type A** — Other School Activity: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show. This request must be made on the Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. This request must be accompanied by a notarized statement, signed by a School Administrator, on school letterhead stating the specific reason a substitute is requested. The completed Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form and the notarized statement must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

**Type B** — Sickness: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show. This request must be made on the Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. This request must be accompanied by a statement, signed by a Physician, on his/her letterhead. The completed Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form and the Physicians statement must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

**Type C** — More Than One Entry In A Class or the Exhibitor Has Entries In More Than One Department Showing At The Same Time: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show or as soon as the problem arises, but in any case no later than the start of the respective Show. This request must be made on the Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. The completed Official STFR Exhibitor Substitution Form must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

In any of the three (3) situations listed above, or in the case of an emergency, the Department Superintendent may use his own discretion as to whether a substitute showman will be allowed. If a positive decision is rendered, the substitute must be from the same school, FFA Chapter or 4-H Club as the original exhibitor with the following two (2) exceptions.

- **a.** The original exhibitor is the only exhibitor from that school, FFA Chapter or 4-H Club entered in that Department.
- **b.** All other members from that school, FFA Chapter, or 4-H Club are exhibiting at the same time.

In either case, any junior exhibitor (meeting all requirements of the Junior Livestock Show exhibitor in the Department entered) meeting the approval of the Department Superintendent may exhibit the animal.

- **Custom Fitting:** Any animal fed or cared for by a custom fitter, at any time during the required ownership feeding and fitting period, is NOT eligible, except in the case of a Junior exhibitor who is a member of the immediate family of a custom fitter. A custom fitter is considered anyone who is not an immediate family member of the family or the CEA or AST. Violators of this rule will be barred from future participation.
- 13. Animal Care: Exhibitors must remain in charge of their exhibits and care for them for the duration of the Show.
- **Stalling:** Animals entered in the Junior Show must be stalled or penned in the division set aside for this purpose. Junior Market Steers, Junior Breeding Heifers, Junior Market Lambs and Junior Market Goats are pre-stalled; see Department rules.
- **15. Weighing:** Steers, lambs, barrows, goats and rabbits will be weighed under the supervision of the Superintendent. This will be the official weight. Re-weighs are NOT permitted. The management reserves the right to weigh-back any animal at any time.
- **Junior Auction Animals:** All placing Market Steers, Lambs, Barrows, Broilers, Roasters, Turkeys, Goats and Rabbits must be sold through the Junior Auction Sale. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals are required to be displayed for the duration of the Show under the care of the exhibitor. The Junior Auction Sale is limited to placing animals. Decoration of market animals for the Junior Auction is prohibited; animals must be presented for Auction in their natural show state (i.e. no glitter, paint, balloons, etc. allowed).

- **17. Junior Auction Exhibitors:** The Junior Exhibitor must be present for the Auction Sale, unless substitution criteria is met, or that lot may be removed from the auction at the discretion of Show Management.
- **18. Junior Livestock Auction Caps:** Livestock Auction Caps are as follows:

The Grand Champion of each species must sell for more than the Reserve Grand Champion of its species. The Reserve Grand Champion of each species must sell for more than lower placing animals of it's species. In the event that the amount bid for an animal exceeds any of the above auction caps, the excess money will be contributed to the auction cap.

**19. Terminal Shows:** This is a terminal Show for lambs, barrows, goats, poultry, rabbits and all placing steers. All lambs, barrows, goats, poultry, rabbits and all placing steers brought onto the grounds must go to market. Non-placing steers have the option to sell at market price or be released to exhibitors. In the event a suitable resale market is not established for a Junior Market Species, Show Management reserves the right to release all animals back to the exhibitor.

**Sift, Non-Place, Premium and Auction Checks:** Owners will be paid for sifted and non-placing animals based on weigh-in weight. Checks for sifted and non-placing animals will be mailed to the 4-H or FFA address. A sales fee will be deducted from all resale lots to defray the cost associated with shipping and handling. If applicable, premium monies for class placings will be distributed by STFR and mailed to the 4-H or FFA address. Auction sale checks will be issued by the STFR Junior Livestock Auction and will be mailed separate from premium checks or floor checks to the 4-H or FFA address. Junior market poultry and rabbit owners will not receive a check for sifted and non-placing animals, as cost of shipping and handling exceeds their market value.

## **Market Animal Disposition**

The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo strives to ensure a fair price for market animal projects. Market conditions may dictate the sale of market animals be conducted through local terminal markets (i.e. sale barns, etc.). STFR reserves the right to charge the exhibitor freight, yardage and any and all marketing fees applicable to the sale of each animal. A sales fee of 5% of the Auction total and floor price will be charged to the seller on all animals sold.

- **21. Animal Load-out:** It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to see that his/her animal is received at the load out area and that the entry number is written on the release.
- **22. Wholesome Meat Act:** The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all market livestock. Only animals eligible for immediate slaughter may be brought onto the grounds and exhibited:
  - **a.** Animals must be in good health and free of drug or chemical residues.
  - **b.** Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
  - **c.** If drug or chemical residues are found in tissue, the entire carcass may be condemned.

STFR will in no way be liable or responsible for the condition of carcasses or the sale price of the animal. In such cases, the exhibitor forfeits all rights to any and all proceeds including: Auction Price, Scholarships, Premium Awards, Market (Floor) Price and Special Awards.

As breeding animals are not entering the food chain, the USDA Wholesome Meat Act does not apply to these animals; however, breeding animals may be closely screened for any performance enhancing compounds. This includes, but is not limited to steroids, diuretics and pain killers.

- **23. Blocking Tables & Trim Chutes:** No Market Lamb Blocking Tables, Market Goat Blocking Tables, Steer Trim Chutes or Junior Breeding Beef Cattle Trim Chutes permitted on grounds. Trim chutes are only allowed during the Open Beef Cattle Show.
- **24. Fans**: Fans will be limited to one (1) fan per three (3) head of steers and one (1) fan per five (5) head of sheep exhibited. No Fans will be permitted in aisles during the Show.
- **Scales:** Exhibitors will NOT be allowed to bring portable scales into the Show Barn. Scales will be provided by the Show. Electronic load bar scales for cattle are permitted in designated locations pending approval of the Superintendent.
- **26. Generators:** No generators permitted on grounds.
- **Clipping:** No clipping will be allowed on grounds in any Junior Show. Touch-up clipping with scissors will be allowed for Junior Steers in designated areas only. Market Steers must have 1/4" or less hair except on the tail switch upon arrival on the grounds. Clipping of lambs / goat boots will be allowed with non-electrical clippers or scissors. No electrical clippers are allowed on heifers once they arrive on the grounds. This includes battery powered clippers.
- **28. Blow Dryers:** No blowers will be permitted during the Junior Market Shows.
- **29. Health Papers:** Health papers are NOT required for Junior Market Animals; however, they are required for all breeding animals. Any changes to the Texas Animal Health Commission Rules and Regulations take precedent over this rule.
- **30. Fire Regulations:** Fire code regulations require that no equipment, showboxes, trim chutes, etc. will be allowed in aisles. Blocking of any aisle will be strictly prohibited. Equipment may be stored in or above assigned pens in the Show Barn.
- 31. Notice to Parents or Guardians of Participants and Participants: STFR, at its election, may choose to use photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of Participants in future publications including but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, television, promotional literature, World Wide Web (Internet) and STFR programs. By allowing your child or ward to enter events of the STFR, you are deemed to have consented to such uses of photographs, video tapes and other likenesses of your child or ward.

- **Validation**: All Junior Market Steers must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Steer Validation Program. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Texas Steer Validation Program will result in disqualification. Show management reserves the right to interpret and amend the Official Validation Rules.
- 3. **Pre-Stalling Requirements**: Junior Market Steers will be pre-stalled. To assist Show Management and the Steer Superintendent, CEAs and ASTs must complete the pre-stall request form and submit to Show Management prior to February 15, 2005 informing of the number of steers their county or chapter will actually bring to the Show. Requests for stalling will be accepted by mail only on the official pre-stall request form available at www.rodeoaustin.com with a CEA or AST signatures. Requests made by phone or fax will NOT be honored. Animals must arrive together to stall together.

Those failing to comply with this request could be stalled separately upon arrival. No stalls will be used for tack or lounging. All members of the same FFA Chapter or County 4-H Club will automatically be stalled together. FFA Chapters and/or 4-H Clubs wishing to be stalled together must each request this in their separate pre-stalling request form.

- 4. Identification: Steers will utilize the validation tag as their identification number at the Show. Exhibitors must checkin and complete the State Validation Tag Number portion of the Superintendent section of the Steer Disposition Form. Upon completion, the exhibitor will be given the remaining sections of the Steer Disposition Form, consisting of the Livestock Office Copy, Market Copy, and Exhibitor Copy. Exhibitors will not be allowed to weigh without the Steer Disposition Form in Hand. Check-in must be completed by Sunday, March 20 at 5:00 pm, or be disqualified.
- **5. Age**: Steers are NOT required to have temporary central incisors in place.
- **6. Hair**: Steers must be shorn to not more than 1/4" on any location of the body, excluding the tail switch. Steers must be shorn before arrival onto the grounds. Steers will be checked at weigh-in for 1/4" length; violation of 1/4" uniform

length over entire body will result in immediate disqualification. Steers not shorn will be disqualified from showing. The decision of the Superintendent will be final.

7. Weights: Weight limits are: minimum 1000 lbs. and no maximum. The Livestock Manager, Livestock Coordinator, or Superintendent may request a weigh-back at any time. Steers weighing more than 60 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.

Steers must be presented for classifying, weighing, and sifting beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, March 21, by breed (British, American followed by Continental). Steers not presented at the scales promptly will be disqualified.

Only the owner or an official substitute junior exhibitor may present steers for weigh-in; Adults will NOT be allowed in the arena. This will be strictly enforced.

**8. Classification**: No papers will be required for any breed. Steer must meet the requirements for his breed. Steers will be visually classified by a three-member committee. Steers will be divided as equally as possible into weight classes by Breed Division. Breed Divisions are listed below.

#### **Breed Divisions:**

- -British (Angus, Hereford, Red Angus, Shorthorn)
- -American (Brahman, Brangus, Red Brangus, Santa Gertrudis, Simbrah, ABC)
- -Continental (Charolais, Chianina, Limousin, Maine-Anjou, Simmental, AOB and Crosses)

All steers classified out of their respective breed division must come back to the arena during the Continental division weigh-in for final classification and weigh-in.

- 9. Sift: Any steer not eligible for the class he is entered in due to weight, hair, soundness, health, etc. will be sifted.
- 10. Fitting: Steers which show evidence of artificial coloring with the exception of hoof dressing on hooves will be sifted.
- 11. **Judging Arena**: Only the owner leading the steer may enter the judging arena.
- **12. Unruly Steers**: The Livestock Manager, Livestock Coordinator, or Superintendent may remove any unruly steer from the Show; there will be no appeal.
- 13. Placing Steers: All placing steers MUST sell in the Junior Market Steer Auction. Approximately 41 Steers will sell in the Junior Livestock Auction. The number of classes in each classification and the number of steers placing and selling from each class will be set by Livestock Show Management after all steers are weighed and classified.
- **14. Class Weigh-back**: 1st and 2nd place steers in each class, as well as random animals chosen at the judge's discretion, will be weighed back at judging. Steers that weigh more than 60 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.
- **Selection of Grand Champion**: All Breed Division Champion Steers are required to compete for Grand Champion Steer. After the Grand Champion has been selected, the Reserve Champion of the Breed Division that furnished the Grand Champion competes with the other Breed Division Champions for Reserve Grand Champion Steer.

Those wishing to attend the selection of the Grand Champion Steer must pre-purchase Rodeo Tickets for Wednesday night, March 23, 2005. Requests for stalling will be accepted by mail only on the official pre-stall request form available at www.rodeoaustin.com with a CEA or AST signatures. Requests made by phone or fax will NOT be honored. Animals must arrive together to be stalled together.

Those failing to comply with this request could be stalled separately upon arrival. No stalls will be used for tack or lounging. All members of the same FFA Chapter or County 4-H Club will automatically be stalled together. FFA Chapters and/or 4-H Clubs wishing to be stalled together must each request this in their separate pre-stalling request form.

- 4. Identification: Lambs will utilize the Texas Lamb Breeders Association tag as their identification number at the Show. Exhibitors must check-in and complete the TLBA Tag Number portion of the Superintendent section of the Lamb Disposition Form. Upon completion, the exhibitor will be given the remaining sections of the Lamb Disposition Form, consisting of the Livestock Office Copy, Market Copy, and Exhibitor Copy. Exhibitors will not be allowed to weigh without the Lamb Disposition Form in Hand. Check-in must be completed by Wednesday, March, 23 at 1:00 pm, or be disqualified.
- **5. Age**: Lambs are NOT required to have milk teeth in place.
- **6. Shearing**: Lambs must be shorn slick to the skin above knee and hock joints before arrival on the grounds. No clipping will be allowed at any time. Hand clipping with non-electrical clippers or scissors of boots is permitted.
- 7. Weighing: Lambs will be weighed under the supervision of the Superintendent beginning at 3:00 p.m. on March 23.
- **Scales**: Scales will be provided by STFR in areas throughout the barn; such scales are unofficial and are provided for exhibitor's convenience only. Official scales, located in the showring, will be used by Superintendents to determine official weights. No other scales will be allowed.
- **9. Weights**: Minimum weight-100 lbs., except Southdown-90 lbs. Maximum weight-160 lbs. Lambs weighing less than the minimum weight or more than the maximum weight at time of official weigh-in will be sifted. 1st and 2nd place lambs in each class, as well as random animals chosen at the judge's discretion, will be weighed back at judging. Lambs that weigh more than 5 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.

Livestock Show Management will break classes following official weigh-in. There will be no pre-set weight breaks. Exhibitors missing their class are ineligible to compete in a different weight division and will be sifted.

# Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Rambouillet, Delaine, Debouillet or a cross between these breeds.
- Silky, white face that is narrow and clean cut.
- Silky ears that are medium to moderate in size.
- Soft pelt.
- White hooves and legs.
- Horns may be present or absent.

## Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Black or brown spots in the skin or wool on the body of the lamb.
- Freckles or pigmented areas of black or brown skin.
- Black pigmentation in the hooves.
- · Black eyelashes.

## Absolute Disqualifications

- Coarse, chalky, white hair on the face, down the back of the hind legs, and in the flanks.
- Black or brown freckles above the hooves in the hairline.
- Solid black hooves.
- Harsh, coarse pelt.
- · Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than redocking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show the callipyge gene.

## FINE WOOL CROSS

# Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must be a cross with evidence of at least 50 % finewool breeding and the other percentage should be predominantly Hampshire and/or Suffolk characteristics.
- Soft pelt that is characteristic of 1/2 blood wool (60's, 62's spinning count).
- Mottling and/or some spotting on face and ears.
- Mottling and/or spotting of legs below the knees and stifle joint.
- Face and ears should be soft and silky.

# Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Face, ears and legs should not be extremely dark or solid in color.
- Colored fiber (black or brown spots) in the wool.
- Absence of wool on the legs below the knees and/or hocks.

# Absolute Disqualifications

- Coarse, chalky, white hair on the face or ears or legs or in the flanks.
- Harsh, coars pelt.
- Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than redocking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.

## **SOUTHDOWN**

# Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Hair color on muzzle and nose should be mouse colored, gray to brown.
- Pigmentation of nostril may be black to purplish-gray.
- Muzzle should be broad with a head of moderate length.
- Ears should be of moderate length, covered with short hair or wool.
- Hoof color should be black.
- Dark pigmentation on hide is acceptable. Birth marks are acceptable.

- Total pink pigmentation of nostrils.
- Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than redocking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.

This division generally includes the Suffolk and Hampshire breeds, plus all lambs that do not fit in Finewool, Finewool cross or Southdown breed divisions.

#### STANDARDS FOR BARROW CLASSIFICATION:

All animals must be properly ear notched within seven (7) days of birth with a litter notch in the right ear and individual notch in the left ear to be eligible for the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program and entry in the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo. Animals not properly notched in both ears will be disqualified.

## **DUROC**

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character (ears must be down and medium size).
- Must not have any white hair located on the animal.
- Must not have any black hair.
- Must not have more than one black spot on the skin larger than one inch in diameter.
- Must not have shading or indication of a belt.

# **HAMPSHIRE**

- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
- Must possess Hampshire Breed Character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
- Must not have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- Must not have any red hair.

## **YORKSHIRE**

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed Character (ears must be erect).
- Must not have any colored hair other than white.
- Must not have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
- Must not have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

## CHESTER WHITE — (OPB WHITE)

- Must possess Chester White breed character.
- Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than silver dollar, no colored hair.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

## **LANDRACE** — (OPB WHITE)

- Must be white in color and possess Landrace Breed Character (ears must be down).
- Must not allow any color hair other than white.
- Must not allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation.
- Must not allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.

# **POLAND CHINA** — (OPB DARK)

- Must possess Poland China breed character.
- Must be black with six white points (face, feet, and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
- Must have ears down.
- Must not have evidence of belt formation.
- Cannot have red or sandy hair and/or pigmentation.
- Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering of ears with possible ear tags are ineligible.

## **SPOTTED** — (OPB DARK)

- •Must be black and white.
- •Must possess Spotted Breed character.
- •Ears must be down and reasonably sized.
- •Any red tinted or brown sandy spots are ineligible.
- •No solid black head from ears forward.
- •No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.

## **BERKSHIRE** — (OPB DARK)

- A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
- Must have white on all four (4) legs, face, and tail.
- Must not have a solid white or black face from ears forward.
- Must not have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
- White is allowed on the ears, but no solid white may appear on the ears.
- One occasional splash of white may appear only on the lower one-half of the body.

Purchase, delivery, possession and registration must all take place on or before November 1st, the year preceding the Show. Superintendents will check Original Registration Certificates at time of check-in.
- 3. **Pre-Stalling Requirements**: Junior Breeding Heifers will be pre-stalled. To assist Show Management and the Heifer Superintendent, CEAs and ASTs must complete the pre-stall request form and submit to Show Management prior to February 15, 2005 informing of the number of heifers their county or chapter will actually bring to the Show. Requests for stalling will only be accepted by mail only on the official pre-stall request form available at www.rodeoaustin.com with a CEA or AST signatures. Requests made by phone or fax will NOT be honored.

Those failing to comply with this request, could be stalled separately of one another upon arrival. No stalls will be used for tack or lounging. All members of the same FFA Chapter or County 4-H Club will automatically be stalled together. FFA Chapters and/or 4-H Clubs wishing to be stalled together must each request this in their separate prestalling request form.

- **Disqualification**: Any animal which shows evidence of artificial coloring, except hoof dressing on hooves, will be disqualified.
- **5. Fans**: Fans will NOT be permitted in aisles.
- **6. Generators**: No generators will be allowed on grounds.
- 7. Trim Chutes: No trim chutes will be allowed on the grounds during the Junior Breeding Heifer Show.

- **8. Clipping**: No electrical clippers will be allowed on the grounds.

# 2005 CALF SCRAMBLE RULES AND REGULATIONS

## **ELIGILIBITY:**

- Contestant must have reached their 12th, but not their 18th birthday on January 1, 2005 and not be enrolled beyond their Junior year in High School. Contestants must be active participants in a FFA or 4-H program and reside in the state of Texas.
- 2. Each participant must complete a current Minor's Release. Incomplete and faxed minor releases will not be accepted. All information requested on the Minor Release must be complete, with original signatures (no copies). The Release must be signed by the parents and contestant along with the notary and the County Agent or Ag. Science Teacher. Both parents must sign the Release. However, if the parents are divorced, or if one is deceased, one signature is sufficient, but the notation of "divorced" or "deceased" must be made or the Minors Release will be returned.
- **3.** Contestants will be permitted to catch a calf no more than one (1) time in his/her 4-H or FFA career.
- 4. The Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo, (STFR) of Austin, Texas will not be responsible for any accidents which may occur to any contestant in the Calf Scramble before, during or after the scramble.

#### **SELECTION OF CONTESTANTS:**

- Contestants will be selected ONLY by CEA's or AST's. CEAs and ASTs will then submit selected contestants along
  with Minor Releases to their Area Coordinator for ASTs or District Administrator for CEAs. The Area Coordinator
  and District Administrator will submitted the final list of contestants to STFR no later than October 1, 2004.
- 2. Contestants will be notified through their supervisor of their acceptance and the date and time they are to participate, if applicable.
- 3. The Interscholastic League State Executive Committee, in cooperation with the State Board of Vocational Education, has formulated a plan to permit calf scrambles and still protect contestant's amateur standing. This is done by placing the matter under the supervision of the Agricultural Science Department of the School and the CEA's, and prohibiting the participants from receiving anything of cash value for winning the athletic part of the program.

#### **ARENA RULES:**

- 1. Contestants will carry into the arena a halter, with attached ten foot rope which will be supplied by STFR. Neither the halter nor the rope may be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed on the animal in the usual way.
- 2. Contestants may not work as a "team". Each contestant will attempt to catch and halter one of the calves. Each contestant catching a calf is required to lead that calf across the finish line without aid. After placing the halter on the calf, the contestants will not be permitted to fasten the rope to themselves in any manner to aid in leading the calf over the finish line.
- 3. If a contestant has hold of a calf, no other contestant will be allowed to touch the calf unless it breaks away. If two or more contestants catch the same calf, they will be ordered by the referee to release the calf.
- 4. If a calf is caught by the tail, the contestant will be allowed a reasonable amount of time to place the halter on; however, at the direction of the referees, the contestant must let the calf go.
- **5.** Poor sportsmanship will automatically disqualify the contestant and undue roughness (i.e. abuse, choking calves, pulling of tails, etc.) will not be tolerated.
- **6.** There will be no less than 8 referees appointed.
- 7. The Show reserves the right to modify or change any of the arena rules. Notification of any such modification or change will be made to the contestants prior to the scramble performance.

## **PURCHASE CERTIFICATE RULES:**

- 1. Purchase Certificates issued in the amount of \$1,000.00 (except for special awards) must be used in the purchase of Breeding Beef Heifers that must be approved by the AST or CEA, and used as the contestant's FFA or 4-H project. The contestant must return to the 2005 Show, Junior Breeding Heifer Show.
- 2. Purchase Certificates will not be issued to the contestant until the contestant submits a sponsor thank you letter to the STFR office. The letter must be submitted to the STFR office in an unsealed, pre-paid postage envelope, addressed to the sponsor.
- **3.** Payment on scramble certificates will not be made to the seller until the ORIGINAL transferred registration certificates and health papers accompany the original scramble certificate are received in the Livestock Office.
  - a. Original Registration Certificates will be used to verify ownership date for breeding animals. Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in the name of the Junior owner on or before the required ownership date. Purchase, delivery, possession and registration must all take place on or before September 15. Superintendents will check original registration certificates at the time of check-in.
  - b. WHEN RETURNING CERTIFICATES FOR PAYMENT, please follow the following guidelines or payment will be delayed:

THESE DOCUMENTS MUST ARRIVE TOGETHER.

- 1. Calf Scramble Certificate: signed by the supervisor, seller, and student.
- **2.** Original transferred registration papers.
- **3.** Valid health papers.

NOTE: If a calf scramble certificate from another major Stock Show is being used in addition to the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Calf Scramble Certificate to purchase an animal, the original breed registration paper and the health papers must be sent by the breeder or the exhibitor to the Stock Show which takes place the earliest on the calendar year. After the appropriate copies are made, the first Stock Show then forwards the original documents to the other Show(s) whose certificate values were allocated towards purchasing the given animal. The last Stock Show of the calendar year which has provided a scramble certificate towards the given animal shall receive and hold the original documents and forward them to the exhibitor upon completion of their project at all of the Stock Shows involved.

- 4. Participants will NOT be allowed to purchase animals from themselves, immediate family members or their ranches (family ranches or partnerships), or their Agriculture Science Teacher or County Extension Agent. If livestock is purchased for less than the amount of the certificate, a check will be issued to the seller from the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo, for the actual cost of the animal only. Checks will not be issued to 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters, students, parents or supervisors.
- 5. Winners must submit appropriate entry materials through their supervisor by December 1, 2004, and exhibit their breeding animals at the 2005 Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Junior Breeding Heifer Show. Certificates may be combined with certificates from other major Stock Shows as long as the animal is brought back to STFR the following year. The original registration papers will be mailed to the exhibitor after the scramble animal has been shown in the STFR breeding Show and the Official Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Record Book has been received in the Livestock Office.
- 6. Official Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Calf Scramble Report Forms and Record Book, obtained from either the CEA, AST or STFR, stating the breed of heifer bought and the progress made, including feed and animal health records, must be prepared by the contestant and submitted to the CEA or AST. The CEA or AST will forward the reports to STFR with his/her recommendations as to whether or not the contestant should receive title to the livestock. The entire program will be under the supervision of the CEA or AST. The Official Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Calf Scramble Record Book must be either delivered or received by mail, to the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Livestock Office by 5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2005. Reports received after 5:00 p.m. on February 15, 2005 will be ineligible for record book awards.

7. Participants who fail to fulfill their obligations as stated in these rules will result in revocation of the Calf Scramble Certificate and will require repayment of certificate value to STFR.

The Interscholastic League State Executive Committee in cooperation with the State Board of Vocational Education has formulated the following model for the Calf Scramble Rules which permits the event, but still protects the participants amateur standing. This is done, as will be noted in the rules, by placing the whole matter under the supervision of the Agricultural Science Department of the School and prohibiting the participants from receiving anything of cash value for winning the athletic part of the program.

- **a.** A participant shall not receive rewards of any kind for participating in a Calf Scramble.
- **b.** Special awards may be given for these animals when they are exhibited in competition with other animals, and all awards money and other money derived from the sale of the animal will belong to the participant as a reward for their labor, feed, veterinary, insurance and other costs, after the year's project has been completed and the animal shown at the Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo Livestock Show.
- c. Title to an animal received in a scramble shall NOT pass to the participant catching the calf until the participant has demonstrated under competent supervision their interest in caring for the animal and their ability to follow competent instructions in feeding, grooming and showing said animal. The animal must be returned for exhibit at the next Show, unless circumstances approved by the Livestock Show Management of the Show concerned, and Supervisor make this impractical, before title is turned over to the participant. (For example: The animal may turn out to be unsuitable for the project due to deformity, disease, or other unforeseen reasons, or the student is failing in school).
